Did you know that Sign language covers auditory, visual, and kinesthetic learning styles, improving children's cognitive development?

Auditory learners: As instructions are usually given vocally, these kids fit in well. To help retain and understand new vocabulary, we recommend speaking new signs.

Visual learners: Signs can help learners understand and retain information by connecting words and concepts with visuals/pictures.

Kinesthetic learners: This lets children learn through movement while using sign language.

Signing covers all three learning styles, making learning fun and effective. This can boost academic performance across subjects. ASL improves academic achievements.

Make a list of your students. Assess and reflex on their style of learning. Note it can be a mixture, but most children lean heavier toward one type.
