5 Ideas for Online Meetings

Preparing students for an emergency:

Week 1 goal: Students know their phone number. Week 2 goal: Students know their address. Week 3 goal: Students know names in their home. Week 4 goal: Students know what to do in an emergency. Download the lessons here.

- Adjust these ideas to make it grade or age-appropriate.
- If students do not have a printed version, direct them to use a sheet of paper to complete the activities.
- Some work may require caregiver assistance.
- I Know My Address. Students need to know their address. This life skill should be done privately to avoid sharing personal information. Follow instructions on the worksheets.
- 2. **Guess How Many.** See instructions on the worksheet. This will help students to notice their surrounding.
- 3. **Find the missing object.** Gather object around your home that can be a pair (pencil/eraser, shoes/socks, bowl/spoon, cup/water). Hold up one object for kids to find in their home in 30-60 sec. Everyone comes back to share. For younger kids, show both objects so they know what to look for.

4. My favorite room activity.


Guess How Many
