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Instructions:

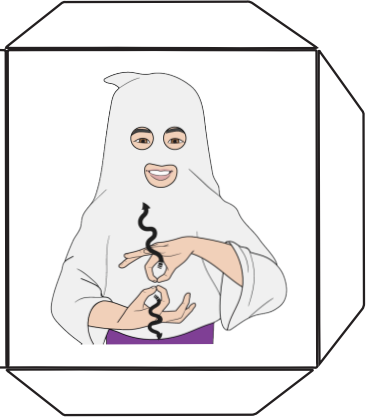
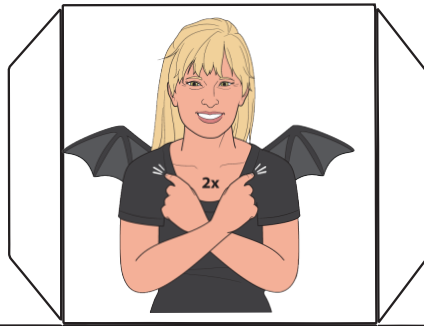
1. Roll dice then sign the word or say the word for the sign.

5. Roll dice then everyone tries to sign or say the word at the same time.

For best results, use cardstock paper. Cut and glue together at tabs.

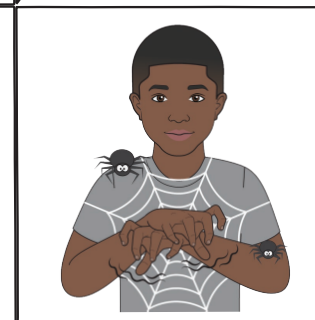
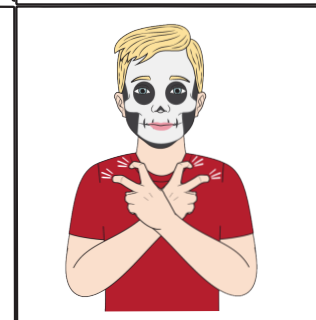


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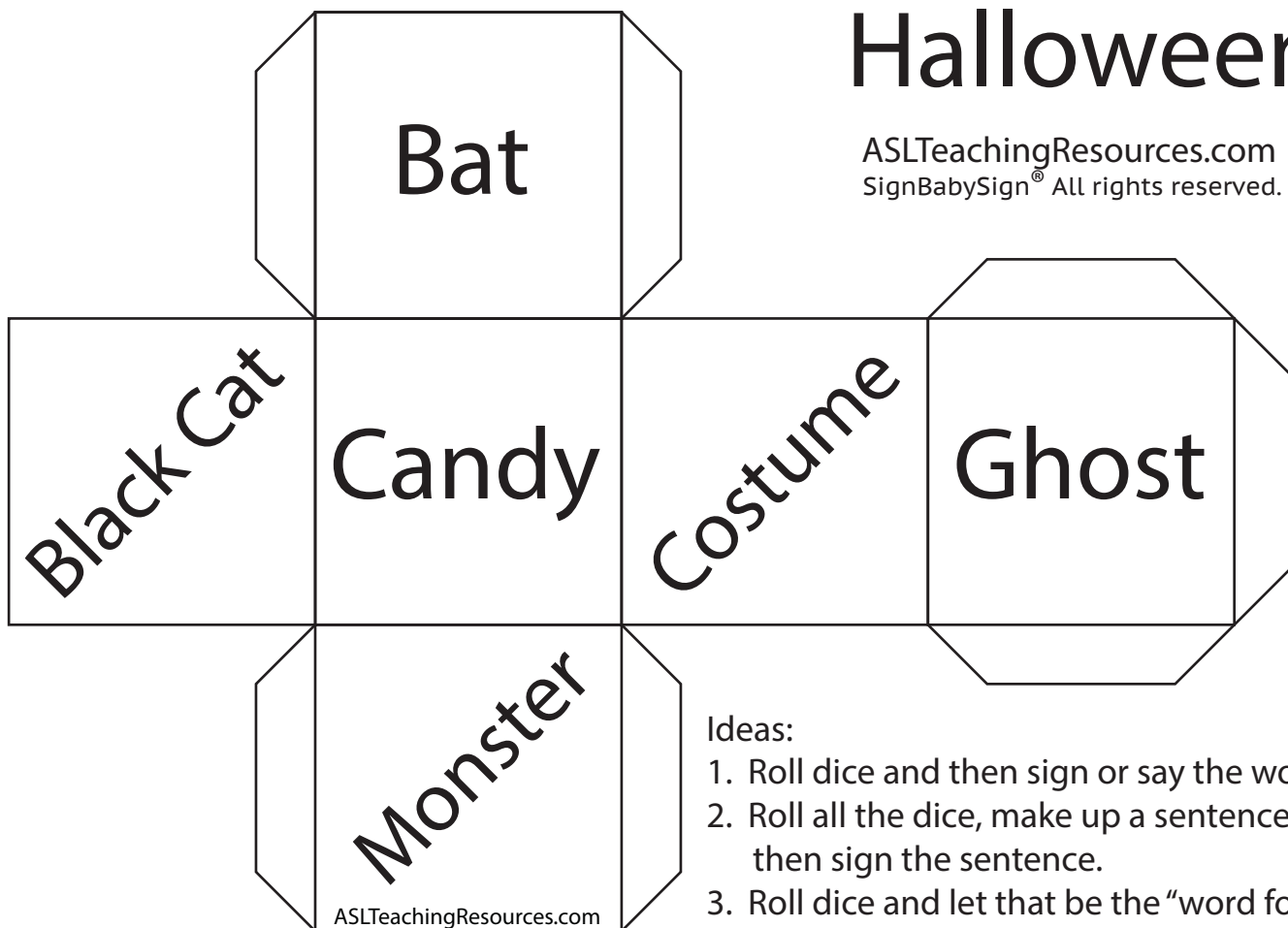
Ideas:

5. Roll dice and then everyone tries to sign or say the word at the same time.

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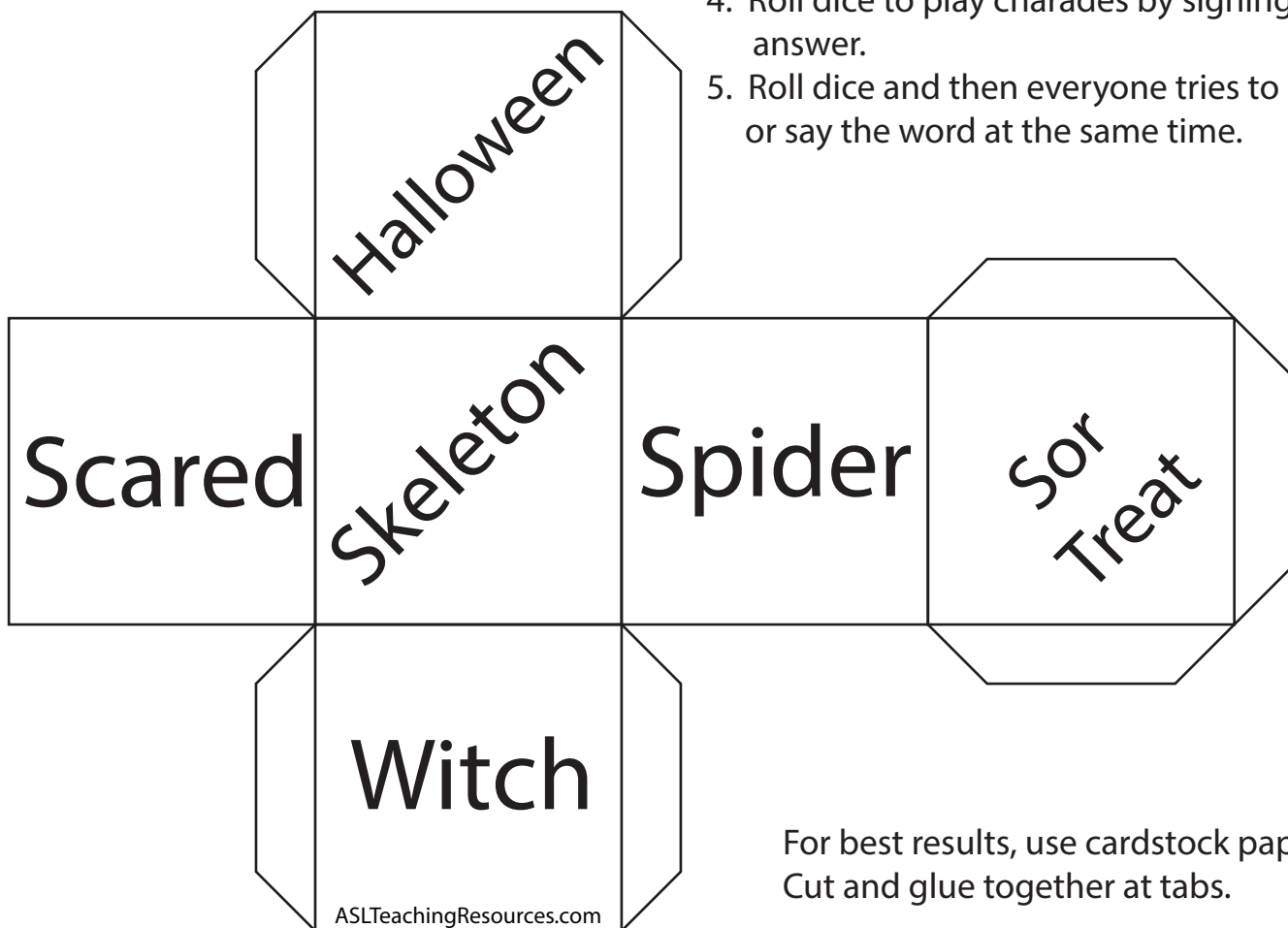
