Hints for using this book:


- 1. Start with a sign each day or each week, building sign vocabulary as you go.
- 2. When teaching new vocabulary, SHOW the written word in English, SIGN the word in ASL, and SAY the word. Incorporating all three learning styles (visual, auditory, kinesthetic) is a powerful tool to engage students.
- 3. Increase receptive and expressive vocabulary with our flashcards, dice, and videos.
- 4. Send home handouts for parents to learn and reinforce signs learned.

Ideas for incorporating sign language in your daily activities:

- 1. Use signs daily, especially during your routine transitions (lunch, bathroom).
- 2. When signing, make eye contact and keep your hands empty when possible.
- 3. Use objects and fingerspelling to introduce signs (e.g. teach the sign "apple" and the letter "a" while showing an apple). This iconic approach increases comprehension.
- 4. During activities, reading, or singing: sign key words, have students sign them, or ask questions where children sign the answer.
- 5. Have a theme day to emphasize new signs. Each time the word is said it must be signed.
- 6. When teaching reading skills or during story time, use signs for key words. Tape the flash cards throughout your books at the appropriate places. Children can read and be reminded of the signs. The added dimension of signing will help to reinforce vocabulary.
- 7. Use sign as a tool in classroom management by directing students as to what to do next or to address a student across the room.
- 8. Incorporating fingerspelling can provide an additional method to learning new spelling words, engaging children who are more visual or kinesthetic.
- 9. Dedicate a place in your room for the wall charts. Add more as you learn.
- 10. Introduce quiet times where children can only communicate in sign to each other.



The Sight Word Flashcaras

- Read it ~ Students point to the word and sound it out/read it.
- Touch it ~ Students touch each word as they read it.
- Fill it ~ Students write the missing letter of the sight word in the blank box.
- ◆ Paste it ~ Students cut out letters in the right column and then place them in the correct order in the empty boxes. Note: Extra set of the cutouts are included in this packet.
- Trace it ~ Students trace the word to practice their knowledge of letters and associate them with forming words. Tracing can be done with a pencil, fingers, or even paint.
- Unscramble it ~ Students re-write the correct sight word on the line.
- Write it ~ Students write the sight word.
- Find it ~ Students find and point to the featured sight word.
- Circle it ~ Students circle the sight word with a pencil, pen, or dry erase marker.

This version is reusable. Keep in the classroom or send home for extra practice. Materials needed: Laminator, cardstock, 1" binder rings, scissors, hole puncher.


- Print cardstock, laminate, and cut out cards...

- It is ready to use!






