Category: Emotions Activity Book

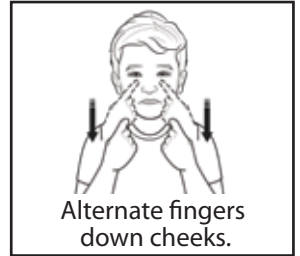

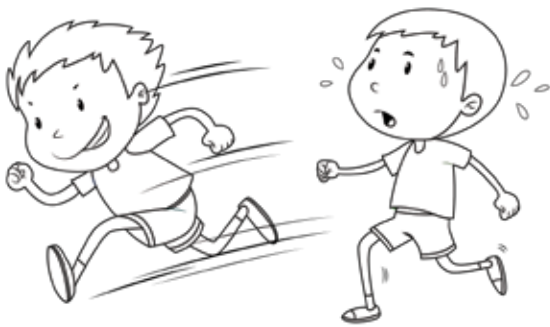
