pencil, tape, craft supplies


Students follow directions on each worksheet.


Craft: Decorate Thumbs-up picture with stickers, glitter, etc. Tape to student's desk.

Game: Ask students a series of questions they could either like or dislike to give thumbs up or down for answer.

Idea: Color mini thumbs-up with different colors of the rainbow, have students draw lines matching the colored thumbs. Bonus: Can reinforce color signs.



 Thumb taps chest 2x.


Fine

Color the thumbs, cut them out and tape on a stick.

Craft: Decorate a water bottle to give away to help someone feel fine/better.

Game: Put a sticker on the back of the child's hand each time they sign "fine". For success, ask questions often to get the "fine" sign.

Idea: Use the thumbs and ask a series of questions for children to give a thumbs up or down.








Directions:


- 1) Teach your students that the handshape for the "I'm fine" sign is similar to a high five.

- 5) Throughout the week, encourage your students to give each other a thumbs up sticker when they see a classmate doing something nice.




